### **PREFACE**

On 16th and 17th June 2013, the State of Uttarakhand had a cloudburst and flashfloods in the upper reaches of Himalayas in which five districts were severely affected. Uttarkashi district was also impacted with blockade of roads, damage to life and property, public and private infrastructure, commercial establishments and critical services. Rescue operations were done through helicopters along with land-route based rescues, supported by the Indian Army, ITBP, Police forces, NDRF, and local people who evacuated the stranded tourists and pilgrims.

Just after the rescue operations, the district administration provided civil supplies, food, water, clothing, blankets, fuel, etc to the stranded pilgrims and the local villagers whose access points had been washed away. Many NGOs, Corporates and Trusts, also came forward to help the administration in this phase. By 28 June all rescue efforts of pilgrims had been completed and relief activities targeting cut-off villages continued in full vigor. As the administration then began to think of rehabilitation and reconstruction, there was a need to understand the needs across all sectors in a comprehensive manner.

The United Nations Disaster Management Team (UNDMT), supported the District Administration by making Social Sector Plan and coordinating the response and rehabilitation initiatives between the Administration and support agencies. In Uttarkashi, UNDMT deputed two experts, Ms. Rashmi Panuily (mid July 2013 to mid September 2013) and later Dr. P. D. Mathur (mid September 2013 to March 2014), who have worked with the district administration tirelessly and have helped the administration in developing and executing the procedures, for coordinating with the NGOs, Corporates & Trusts. They, along with our departmental heads and field staff, identified the needs of the district. The Social Sector Plan, Need-Gap matrix that they prepared was very handy in communicating the gaps to various agencies. They also helped us in developing the formats for various activities especially the Authorization Letters and MoUs. Due to this coordinated action, more than 14 agencies have been working in the district for the last few months—supporting in rebuilding lives of the communities, improving livelihood and restoring some of the vital infrastructure along with the civil administration.

Presently, the district is focusing on completion of the permanent shelters for the 313 beneficiaries whose houses have been taken up by World Bank funded housing scheme. NGOs and Trusts are also making some houses for the benefit of people with a target to complete it before the onset of next monsoon. Another priority for the district administration is the permanent restoration of the infrastructure including the roads, bridges, bridal paths, etc.

I feel that it was combination of efforts and coordination by all of us that helped us overcome the tough times after this great disaster. The district administration is committed to continue coordinating with various support agencies that are working in the district. It will only be our joint efforts and coordination that will help us overcome the disaster completely and lead people to better lives.

### INTRODUCTION & OVERVIEW OF DAMAGE

Uttarkashi district is located in the extreme northwest of the Uttarakhand state and is spread over an area of 8016 square km. The population density of the district is 40 per square km, which is the lowest among the districts of Uttrakhand. Its northern boundary touches Tibet and Himachal Pradesh. The district is located between Bhagirathi and Asi Ganga Rivers. For administrative purposes the district is divided into 6 blocks, 427 gram panchayats, 673 villages, 2 Nager Panchayats and one Municipal area.

In the recent years, Uttarkashi has been facing the brunt of multiple natural disasters that has destroyed peace and development efforts. It is constantly trying to overcome the damages and losses.

The flash flood on 16-17 June 2013, in Bhagirathi and in Ashi Ganga, occurred due to cloudburst accompanied by landslides due to which 300 villages, of 6 blocks in the district were severely affected. There was wide-spread damage to state roads, connecting roads and bridges, footpaths, and private and public properties. Bhatwari and Gangori areas of Ganga valley and Barkot-Hanumanchatti area of Yamuna valley were cutoff for several days from rest of Uttarkashi. Access to district headquarters and Maneri-Gangotri areas is still difficult. About 135 villages were disconnected. Helicopters, porters and mules were supplying the daily needs of the affected families. Due to continuous rain, repairing and opening up of roads for commuters was almost impossible to handle in the initial days.

Among all the six blocks, Bhatwari and Naugaon are the most affected areas. Bhagirathi River has changed its flow washing away hundreds of houses, hotels, agricultural land, road, and bridges. Maximum villages (63) that were cut off from motorable roads are in Bhatwari block and then Chinyalisaur (43 villages). This non-connectivity affects people's livelihood status and creates difficulties to access necessary services in time.

Apart from roads and bridges, drinking water supply tanks and pipe lines also have ruptured. The district reported damages to 837 residential houses, of which 310 are completely and 527 are partially damaged. Education department lost 72 primary schools completely and 125 partially. About 24 secondary schools were affected, out of which 2 are completely damaged. 14 Aganwadi centers were also affected, out of which 6 are completely damaged and 8 are partially damaged. Due to the floods and building collapse 7 are reportedly dead and 6 are injured seriously. Livelihoods have been badly impacted as most of the population depends mainly on agriculture and tourism for its survival and growth.

### THE SOCIAL SECTOR PLAN

The Government of Uttarakhand invited the United Nations to organize a Emergency Needs Assessment immediately after the disaster to find out if there are any life threatening issues at hand. That Assessment conducted in the first half of July 2013 showed that although there were issues in terms of connectivity and access to services, the threat to human life was minimal. Following this, the Government asked the support of United Nations to assist in preparing a district level Social Sector Plan covering Health, Education, Food Security, Livelihood and Shelter. The SSP of Uttarkashi was prepared with technical assistance from UNDMT. The objective of SSP was that affected communities must be able to recover from the shock of the disaster at the quickest time in the transitional phase. The overarching goal was: to quantify the needs for each of the sectors to enable a convergent and coordinated recovery process wherein Government, NGOs and corporate sector could bring-in their respective capacities and capabilities to implement the plan. The scope of the sectoral plan included both the development deficits and the needs emerging out of the damage from the recent disaster. Hence the plans aspired to reduce both the primary and the underlying risk factors.

Recovery from the impact of floods is an opportunity to initiate improvements in quality of life and changes in attitudes about risk while undertaking reconstruction tasks. Sustainable reconstruction efforts after a disaster can help revive the local economy, restore livelihoods, and improve access to housing, its quality and safety, as social and community well infrastructures. Peoples "participation in reconstruction activities through processes such as owner-driven reconstruction reinforce equity and strengthen community networks.

While the Needs Assessment points to a number of specific interventions and activities for future recovery, the real challenge in a vulnerable State such as Uttarakhand is to ultimately achieve policy and institutional paradigm shifts towards mainstreaming disaster risk management into the development process rather than onetime initiative of focusing on small groups of people, or a recovery that is through short-term project approaches.

### STATUS OF SOCIAL SECTOR PLAN

After the preparation of plan, they were placed before various line-departments at the district and state level, and also to the corporate agencies and NGOs. The stakeholders pick from the needs mentioned in Social Sector Plans based on their mandate, capacity and geographical presence. Negotiations were done at this level to avoid duplication, improve quality of recovery plan, and strengthen close coordination between all stakeholders. In the next stage the Corporate or NGO submit detailed project proposal (DPP) to the district administration for contributing to the recovery process. UNDMT team facilitated the interface as well as the formulation of the DPPs. Subsequently the districts and state administrations then issued an authorization on the basis of the DPP submitted by the NGO or corporate or sign a MoU with the third party (Corporate or NGO) so that the DPPs are taken forward. A detailed list of agencies and their contact details are given in Annexure – 1. Certain activities which require administrative action are taken up by the district administration or state government. In brief, all the DPPs systematically implement parts of the SSP. Hence the SSPs are helping various stakeholders to come together to initiate a coordinated recovery process in the worst affected areas.

In Uttarkashi, there is one district level hospital which is functioning, and headed by Principal Superintendent of district hospital. Apart from this, there are three (3) CHCs in the Block Headquarters of Chinyalisaur, Navgaon and Purola Blocks of the District with capacities of 10, 30 & 50 beds respectively. One Pharmacist, one Lab technician, two health instructors, two ANMs & Nurses are also attached to these CHCs. Also there are 10 PHCs in 06 Blocks of the district. All PHCs have one Physician and one Pharmacist. Four PHCs at Bhatwari, Dunda, Chinyalisaur and Mori are also supported by an Optometrist. Each PHC is linked with about 14 to 18 Sub Centers. There is also one ICU in hospital with 4 beds which are operational. Female hospital has 50 sanctioned beds and one new born stabilization unit but there is no facility for treatment as Pediatrician and supporting para medical staff are not available. The District has 83 sub centers, which serve about 676 villages of six blocks, and each Sub Center serves at least 7 to 8 villages. All sub-centers are functional and there is no damage reported.

During emergency period mobile medical teams, including 33 Ayurveda and Homeopathic doctors, were deployed to villages/Sub centers, where roads were cutoff and access to PHC/CHCs was limited.

### 1.2. Organization of Medical Camps

In the aftermath of the disaster, central and state medical teams were sent for organizing health camps in the affected areas. The district health administration and civil societies also established some medical relief posts/ camps in the affected areas.

### 1.3.Reconstruction and Repair of ICDS / Anganwadi Centers

There are 933 AWCs functioning in the District. Out of 933 AWCs, 599 are full and 334 are minicenters, having 1052 sanctioned posts of AWW against which 929 are working. Out of 933 AWC, 14 are completely damaged due to current calamity.

#### 1.4. Human Resource

In Uttarkashi district hospital, against the 27 sanctioned posts of physicians, experts, medical officers, only 9 posts are in position. The hospital is also lacking medical support staff; against 79 sanctioned post of support staff only 54 are working and 26 are vacant including 2 lab technicians and 12 lab assistants. CHC Chinyalisaur has 3 Medical Officers (including one lady doctor and one Ophthalmologist), while CHC Naugaon is headed by one Medical Officer and also served by one Dentist. There is one lady doctor serving two CHCs (Naugaon & Purola) on rotational basis. CHC Purola has two Medical Officers (one Pediatrician & one Physician). For the female hospital no post has yet been sanctioned. A proposal has already been sent to the state government for processing.

In the affected areas, the Central and State Governments and many other organizations deployed doctors and other para-medic staff for one to three months. In Uttarkashi, simultaneously, the support agencies had also deputed doctor and nurses for supporting the Health Department. Karuna Social Service Society in collaboration with CHAI had deployed one doctor and two nurses for one month. Both the Doctor and nurses had supported the District Administration as they were deputed in the district hospital for 15 days.

### **Deployment of a Doctor under NRHM**

Generally, the District Health Deaprtment appoints doctors on contractual basis under NRHM scheme where as per the given guidelines of NRHM, a doctor gets the contract not less than 11 months. Keeping in view the urgent needs of Lady Medical Officer, Gynecologist, Pediatricians & other specialists, the District administration of Uttarkashi assured the agencies that in special conditions the district can waive some of these issues, and can work it out. Alternate arrangements will be done with appropriate steps so that doctors can be deployed on short term assignment as well. The administration also accepted the request of some of the agencies to provide logistic support for Doctors and Medical experts at district to share the service expenses. As per the CMO of Uttarkashi, the weekly rotation is not practical for the district like Uttarkashi, however monthly rotation of medical personnel may be a possibility.

### Process for Deploying Doctor with the District in Emergency Response

Based on the experience in Uttarkashi the following mode of deploying doctors and medical practitioners at the district level is a workable model

- The intending organization proposes the placement of doctor with the name, sex, age, copy of Registration with MCI and copy of Certificate of education – with proposed period for which the doctor is available, which should preferably be not less than one month.
- It is the responsibility of the agency to reach the doctor to the District Headquarters and take her/him back from there.
- The district administration deputes the doctor to a CHC / PHC or any other hospital, and takes care of lodging and travels of the doctor within the district.
- No other payments are paid from either side (between agency and district administration).

### 1.5. Training & Capacity Building

Health department shared a list of 3000 inaccessible villages in the state, of which 500 villages are in the 5 affected districts. The department was intended to seek help in training of Dais in these villages to ensure safe delivery and save lives in times of emergencies when access is a critical issue. This was the safer option available in the current context of non-accessibility of health services to the villages in the form of doctors, ANM and call centers. The Karuna Social Service Society in collaboration with CHAI took an initiative and conducted training for Dais in 03 most affected districts of the state. In Uttarkashi skills of 75 Dais have been upgraded. The Dais were provided with practical demonstration and safe delivery kits that they can use in times of emergencies.

### **Remaining Needs**

There is acute shortage of basic equipments in the district hospital, all 13 PHCs and 2 CHCs of the Uttarkashi. The need for specialists, doctors and support staff in the district hospital and in CHCs and upgrading these centers in terms of equipments and furntitures for pathological labs and equipments like computers, operative tools, solar lights, water purifiers etc, were not taken up by any Support Agencies. All these needs are still standing & would be incorporated in the district health plan while for specialists and doctors, the authorities have been pressing hard to get it from own resources. CHC of Naugaon Block has been selected under PPP Mode for upgradation, with due efforts from the district authorities.

In Uttarkashi, there are 769 primary, 275 upper primary, 52 higher secondary & high schools. There are four degree colleges in the district. In June 2013 floods, a total of 197 primary and upper primary schools were affected, in which 72 schools were completely damaged while 125 schools were partially damaged. Apart from this 24 junior high schools and intermediate schools were also damaged in which 2 schools are completely damaged 22 are partially damaged

### 1.2. Reconstruction/Repair of Primary and Upper Primary Schools

Earlier, the the Rotary International interacted with the Government of Uttarakhand and offered to reconstruct/ or repair all completely and partially damaged primary and upper primary schools in Uttarkashi district, however due to some technical problems, the MoU with Rotary International has been partly withdrawn to the level that Rotary will not be reconstructing the schools. Now the State Government has sanctioned an amount of Rs. 6 Crores for the reconstruction/ repairing of 37 primary schools in the district (see Annexure-2 for details of damaged schools)

### 1.4. Child Friendly Spaces

Various Child Friendly Spaces (CFS) were set up by the support agencies to supplement affected Anganwadi Centers / schools and to protect, to educate and to provide nutrition to the children and to give a safer place to young children and adolescents. The support agencies deployed trained workers/ facilitators at the CFS and also donated learning, recreational and educational kits and toys to these CFS.

### 1.5. Education/ Recreational Kits and Financial Support to Students

Due to the floods and landslides, the schools and ICDS centers were highly impacted. Several children had lost their school books, uniforms and study materials due to damage to their houses. Having seen devastation and death in several places, some of them were traumatized. Therefore, to turn students' focus from disasters and damages, it was a need to provide extra exposure to interesting study tools, replace their lost books and provide other study materials. Playing makes the children forget worries, remain excited about the positive side of life and to

express themselves. Children who have been highly stressed need to have a friendly environment that attracts them to school, besides they feel that they are cared. Such environment can help students learn joyfully and overcome the fear psyche. Some children left education without adequate care or were placed under single parent care which required additional welfare measures for their continued education. Few agencies showed their interest and provided school kits and recreational kits to schools, and financial support to these children.

### 1.6. Education & Child Protection Coordinator

Due to this disaster, all schools were closed for indefinite period. When these schools reopened from after a month, the children were not in position to take up studies. Therefore there was an urgent need of a person/ coordinator who can take care of and mobilize them to return back to their studies. Further, there was need to track school functioning, to monitor the children attendance in these schools. In the case of



Save the Children, their CFS coordinators played the role of child protection and education facilitators at the community level.

### 1.7. Training of Teachers in Psycho Social Support

Due to the traumatic experience many children were under the psychological impact of it and they were either frightened or they showed sense of resentment or anger. Therefore, it was very essential to train at least 60 teachers (10 teachers from each of the 6 blocks) in psycho-social counseling, so that they can help children and other traumatized colleagues (if any) to live normally.

### 1.8. Risk Assessment & School Disaster Management Plans

There are 769 primary and 275 upper primary schools in Uttarkashi district. A detailed comprehensive assessment on the school safety needs to be carried out in different locations of the district. Third party technical support may be taken for risk assessment, risk zonation of schools and the way forward for the "whole school concept" under SSA. Based on the finding 10 model school safety plans in line with appropriate norms of SSA may be developed. However, this need remained unfulfilled and no agency has come forward to take it up.

### **Important Unfulfilled Needs**

Due to some technical problems, the State Government has withdrawn its MoU, signed with Rotary International for the reconstruction support to the 197 primary & upper primary schools (72 completely damaged & 125 partially damaged) in Uttarkashi district. Although the SSA is expected to take up reconstruction / repair of some of the schools immediately, not all can be targeted immediately, which will have an impact on education in the district. Therefore the need of reconstruction/ repairing of these 197 schools is still unfulfilled. Further, 769 primary and 275 upper primary schools in Uttarkashi district require a detailed comprehensive assessment on the school safety (mainly structural vulnerability) in different locations of the district. Third party technical support may be taken for risk assessment, risk zonation of schools and the way forward for the "whole school concept" under SSA. Based on the finding 10 model school safety plans in line with appropriate norms of SSA may be developed. However, these needs have remained unfulfilled as no agency has come forward to support.

In Uttarakhand, Regional Food Comptroller (RFC) controls the supply of food grains, kerosene and other essential items. On demand from the district administration, the RFC provides food grains to the internal warehouses of the district and through FPS it is distributed to the consumers at the determined price.

### 1.2. Food Basket for Affected Families & Supplementary Nutrition

Each village in general has a PDS shop within accessing distance for villagers. About 4397 families from the most affected cluster of villages had been cut off from the main roads. These families got free ration supply (free food grains, sugar, refined oil) through PDS system until the end of September 2013. The NGOs and other few other humanitarian agencies too supported with dry ration to these affected families. However, it was noted that some of these agencies are calling villagers to walk several kilometers to nearby towns or motorways to receive the

food-grains and other stuff, the district administration issued an advisory to all NGOs / Donors advising them not to call the villagers outside of their village to collect relief materials. All materials, if distributed, must be done in the village itself. Calling people to nearby towns to receive relief materials was forbidden to ensure that those at risk are not put under further risk, as often the elderly and disabled could not reach to the receive the supplies.



On the part of the government Just after the disaster in June 2013, the District administration, through SDM and DSO distributed free ration to families in cut of villages. Each affected family received their portion of food packets (covering 15 kg rice, 15 kg wheat flour, 5 kg pulses, 1 kg salt, 1 liter refined oil, 3 kg sugar, 50 gm masala) from PDS (Fair Price Shops) of their village. In Uttarkashi district, the villages namely Joshiyara, Tiloth, Dhontri, Chinyali, Gaynasu, Maneri, Naugaon, and some more places have food grain storage facilities which supported affected areas for food supply and relief distribution. Initially, it was distributed to all flood affected population but later it was restricted to families of those villages where road connectivity was not available.

### 1.3. Distribution of Supplementary Food Nutrition

The free distribution of ration among most affected villages does not take into account the pregnant and lactating mothers separately for the supplementary needs. ICDS is the only source to provide such supplementary support. And therefore few more agencies supported the initiative along with the government in some of the most affected villages.

#### 1.4. Cash for Work Under MNGREGA & Other Activities

Major livelihood activities in the district are agriculture and animal husbandry, and then jobs in private and government sector. In urban and semi-urban areas, religious pilgrimages and tourism related industries or activities provide livelihood for a large population. This disaster has badly hit the district's economy, especially tourism, the largest employment providing sector. People dependent on tourism and other interdependent sectors are the most affected and are beginning to migrate to other regions to start all over again. Floods have not only destroyed tourist infrastructure like hotels, bed and breakfast inns and restaurants but given a blow to tourism allied industries too (e.g. local handicrafts, candle/agarbathi making, woolen weaving, mule rearing for carrying pilgrims). The importance of taking into account the livelihoods of disaster affected populations and, where possible, protecting and developing them, has been increasingly recognised and addressed by all key actors within disaster recovery processes

There are 75018 job card holders in the district, inclusive of 5070 card holders of cluster of affected 32 villages. The State Government has increased the number of days of work from 100 to 150 days. The district administration has utilized the MNREGA scheme and funded for the same in all affected villages. Further, several agencies promoted cash for work and streamlined

with the MNGREGA and went beyond in terms of covering activities that may not otherwise be covered under MNGREGA.

### 1.5. Other Activities Related to Employment & Livelihood Restoration

The major impact of the June 2013 floods in Uttarkashi district have been the loss of livelihoods for majority of the population who are dependent on Agriculture and Tourism. Local people used to work as drivers, cleaners, porters, waiters and provide other services. Therefore, due to indefinite halt of the tourism in this area owing to damaged roads, people dependent on tourism have lost their source of income. Moreover, many people had taken loans to stock for the start of the tourist season. Some of these stocks are lost, as well as income from tourism is not going to be generated this year, therefore such loans cannot be repaid as well as income

from tourism to support livelihoods will not be generated. In some cases people have lost their business units (shops, hotels, hostels) that were built on the banks of the river. Agricultural lands near the river bank have also been completely washed away by flood waters. This has had severe impact on the small and marginal farmers. In the district many agencies have initiated or have planned to intiate activities for livelihood restoration and provide skill development training to the unemployed youths of the region.

### 1.6. Livelihood Planning

Different departments have their subject experts. During district plan all have compiled their information. However, livelihood has come up to be an important issue and thousands of people in the district have lost livelihood because of the disaster. Many agencies and government have also planned to have more Cash Transfer Programs over the next few years. There is a need for a team of livelihood experts (1 in district), including finance experts (1 for promoting financial inclusion and cash transfer), to plan out detailed plan of action with coordination of administration at state and district level. Under the ILSP program the need for one livelihood coordinator will be fulfilled as the government will place an expert in Uttarkashi district. Need for a financial inclusion specialist can be fulfilled by agencies working on livelihood issues and those who have cash transfer programming included into their plan.

A detailed convergent planning as of February 2014 is given in **Annexure - 5** 

### 1.7. Recommendations for Livelihood Support

- 1. Government may plan soft loans; interest free loans and cash transfer programs against intended outputs as major issues for improving livelihood faster.
- 2. Govt. may waive or exempt taxes from affected business sector and other commercial establishments. This may support to overcome some of the losses.
- 3. Agriculture, horticulture animal husbandry should be promoted and investment should rise. This may be done by NGOs, Social Welfare Department, Rural Development Department and Agriculture Department.
- 4. An intensive micro study for identification of potential and alternate livelihood activities is required for hill community of disaster prone area. A livelihood policy will be useful. Agencies with appropriate expertise may help the government for this.
- 5. Most works under MNREGA are planned and mapped by block development officer with guidance of set regulations. Lot of activities have been undertaken under the same to fulfill people's immediate need for cash. It is also essential to see how best the schyeme can be mainstreamed from the perspective of disaster risk reduction. It can be

- connected with individual shelter / house construction, building local connectivity channels like roads and bridges, maintenance of agricultural land, construction of small shops, etc.
- 6. There is a need to increase technical staff (3 engineers for 3 blocks) for designing, planning and fast sanctioning of MNEREGA projects and for implementation of development schemes at village level for affected and needy population.

The Government of Uttarakhand estimates that about 2540 houses were either fully or partially damaged across the five affected districts, which need external assistance to rebuilding. Land issues were also important in shelter reconstruction. Most of the beneficiaries are landless and would require land prior to reconstruction. In the district, 1075 residential houses (only Pucca Houses) are damaged in which 248 are completely damaged, 520 are severely damaged and 207 are partially damaged/ slightly affected. Most number of houses are damaged in Bhatwari tehsil area. Commercial buildings (hotels and shops) are also damaged in the district. No Panchayat building has reported damages.

### 1.2. Construction of Permanent Houses

As on date, the government has released a list of 2347 (reports of DMMC, GoUK) families whose houses will be built by the government through Owner Driven House Construction (ODHC). In Uttarkashi district, 262 houses will be built through ODHC. The government announced a housing policy for the construction of these houses and has taken all necessary efforts to make land available for the landless families; assistance is also provided for designing and construction of houses by arranging an agency to facilitate the process of ODHC and planning for other amenities as well. ### 1.3. Construction of Transitional Shelter

The government is providing rental support to all those families whose permanent houses have been damaged due to floods and presently they are residing in some camps, government buildings or with their relatives. This rental support will be continued till their permanent houses are built. There are 26 families in the district



whose permanent houses have also been damaged but they have no other places to stay till their permanent house is built, therefore transitional shelters were required for them. Habitat for Humanity through its partner Mission for Anath Development Society has came forward to prepare a transit shelter for these families so that they can have a house until their permanent homes are built.

### 1.4. Construction of Multi Purpose Community Structures

In Uttarkashi district during the June 2013 disaster, many pilgrimages/ tourists were stranded at several places due to huge landslides and poor condition of roads. Because of non availability of shelters, food places and other arrangements the situation became more vulnerable. Therefore it was felt by district administration that at least five community structures should be constructed at different strategic locations, where the pilgrimages / tourists can be stayed during any emergency. Federal Bank has come forward to build one such structure, and the need for four more remains.

### 1.5. Distribution of Winter Kits

Many families were staying in the relief camps and other places which were not safer and comfortable for the children, elderly and pregnant women as winter was approaching very fast. Therefore few agencies provided the winter kits consisting of blankets, pullovers, caps, gloves etc, to the affected families.

### 1.6. Geotechnical Investigations of Vulnerable Villages: A Need that is Unfulfilled

There are 673 villages in the district Uttarkashi, out of which 135 villages are affected due to landslides and subsidence. The geotechnical investigation of 36 villages has been carried out by Geological Survey of India and the Geologist of DGM, GoUK. Now 67 villages in the district have been identified highly vulnerable as far as natural hazards (like landslide, cloud burst, soil subsidence etc.) are concerned. People of these 67 villages may have to be relocated for recovery and rehabilitation in a safer place. District administration must have a comprehensive study of these villages, which will be certainly helpful to the district administration. Agencies and technical institutions may support the district administration for this very important task.

### **WAY FORWARD**

### Reducing Disaster Risk

This includes various mechanisms including the development of detailed hazard zonation maps (multi-hazard) by application of various modeling, coupled with digitally available terrain data and GIS. This will have to be linked to the development of a process to enforce ground compliance with the multi hazard mapping, which is typically a task for district administrations and enforcement authorities upto the lowest level of governance.

### Managing Disaster Response and Preparedness

This includes the development of standard operating procedures to be activated by all agencies and the coordination mechanism for its observance. It should also include training and capacity building of GoUK functionaries at all levels in the methodology and techniques of disaster risk reduction and in post-disaster needs assessments. Preparedness need to include the terms on which functioning of all stakeholders will operate during emergencies.

### Managing Vulnerability

This includes activities such as developing and implementing programs for community awareness building and engagement in hazard risk management, and provision of adequate community-owned and community-operated early warning and emergency response systems. Development deficits arising from lack of access to services and socio-economic disparities needs to be addressed to through appropriate interventions.

### **CONCLUSION**

Repeated large-scale catastrophic events in Uttarakhand have brought significant destruction, hindering economic performance and depriving communities of their assets, livelihoods, and labour force, all too often locking them into endemic poverty cycles. And each year, the State is plagued with similar disasters, impacting thousands of people and destroying their lives and livelihoods.

The devastation wrought by disasters in the region, however, has also presented an opportunity to initiate improvements in quality of life and changes in attitudes about risk while undertaking reconstruction tasks. As seen in examples across the region, good reconstruction after a disaster can help revive the local economy, restore livelihoods, and improve access to housing, its quality and safety, as well as social and community infrastructures. Peoples' participation in reconstruction activities, such as owner-driven reconstruction, reinforces equity and strengthens community networks.

While the measures in the needs assessment point to a number of specific interventions and activities, the real challenge in the region is to ultimately achieve institutional paradigm shifts towards mainstreaming disaster risk reduction in the State rather than one-time initiatives focusing on small groups of people, or led through short-term project approaches. There is an urgent need for long-term transformation on how we manage risk to ensure that the normal stay of development interventions is not put in jeopardy.
